PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)

The course aims to develop knowledge about obligation law relations and autonomous academic skills, including deep comparative legal analysis. The purpose is to enable students to research legal institutes and develop understanding about the relations between creditor and debtor in Civil law, with specific reference to most important theoretical problems in domestic law.
