The Summer School and Young Researchers Forum *Local and Regional Governments at the Crossroads* offers young researchers the possibility to meet and discuss research topics and methodologies, share and develop ideas, learn from each other and gain knowledge from senior researchers in a friendly and supportive environment.

The Summer School will provide a unique overview of ongoing university research of local and regional governance and related disciplines (public administration, administrative science, law, economics, public management, sociology, political science), and extensive opportunities for informal discussion, social interaction, and networking.

The Summer School and Young Researchers Forum will help young researchers to be more confident, efficient and effective writers by providing a systematic explanation of what an academic paper really is; how to write it; how to organise it; how to present a research; and which vocabulary should be used to make best presentation. Applications will be selected based on past research productivity and future promise.

Benefits:

- Showcase your research in local and regional governance or related disciplines through presentations.
- Learn about career development and the latest research tools in public administration.
- Networking and establishing the cooperation of young researchers from diverse institutions.
- The Summer School will provide an opportunity for interaction with other young researchers and renowned senior researchers across Europe.
- Possibility to interact and share ideas with both peers and mentors.

Eligibility:

- Young researchers dealing with local and regional governance, administrative science, law, economics, public management, sociology, political science, social work (e.g. PhD students, post-doctoral fellows, trainees) are the focus of the Summer School.
- None of the authors should have senior position or faculty position.
- Participants should be below the age of 33.

Certificate of Attendance:

Each participant will receive a certificate of attendance. The certificate will include a brief course description, which may be sufficient for their home University to grant a certain number credit points for the attendance. We will suggest **one ECTS** for researchers who participate in Young Researchers Forum and **four ECTS** for researchers who participate in the Summer School (five ECTS for participation in both events).

Researchers who participate in Summer School are expected to deliver a brief written paper on their work (PhD topic) and give a presentation about an issue concerning local and regional governance or related matters (10-15 min) during the Young Researchers Forum on Friday. Researchers who participate in Young Researchers Forum are expected to give a brief presentation of their research (10-15 min) during the Young Researchers Forum on Friday.
